History Corner

Doris Miller The Hero Cook

Doris Miller Park is one of our beautiful communities in Honolulu, but many new residents ask where the name comes from. The story of Doris "Dorie" Miller starts on December 7th, 1941 at 6:00 AM aboard the West Virginia. Dorie Miller was a crewmember who had just finished making breakfast for his crew and was about to begin his laundry duties when the first battery of torpedoes hit the West Virginia.

While heading to his assigned battle station, he discovered that it had been destroyed and instead reported for duty. He had never used a machine gun before but, was given a crash course on how to use an unmanned Browning .50 caliber anti-aircraft machine gun. He was only expected to load it but, immediately started firing the gun at enemy planes grounding at least two. When he ran out of ammunition, he started carrying injured sailors to safely.

Doris Miller was awarded the Navy Cross personally by Admiral Nimitz on May 7th, 1942 aboard the USS Enterprise. We are proud to honor such a hero within our Military Housing.





Shaka Shaka

Ever wonder where our "Shaka" came from? No one knows for sure but, local lore attributes it to Hamana Kalili of Laie. He lost 3 middle fingers in an accident and worked on the sugar cane trains as a security guard. We would wave at the children using his pinky and thumb, and the children started to imitate him. Today it is used as a greeting, a sign of approval or, solidarity. Either way, make use of it to show your Aloha spirit!
