## **5. Cageless Shark Diving**

While this activity is not for the faint of heart, it's well worth the jitters. Get up close to beautiful sharks and other ocean wildlife all while monitored by professional safety divers. Where else except Hawaii will you get this chance?





#### **4. Iolani Palace**

This iconic home to Hawaiian royalty is one of the best ways to learn about the beautiful place we live. Built by King Kalakaua in 1882 and lovingly restored to it's former glory, this palace is a symbol of Hawaiian heritage and culture.

#### 3. Ko Olina Lagoons

## 2. Ray's Kiawe Broiled Chicken

# **Tips for Fighting Home Humidity & Moisture**



Take these steps to keep the AC in your home running efficiently and to prevent moisture and humidity problems:

- The thermostat should remain on "AUTO" at all times. Do not set the System to "ON"
- Set your thermostat to 78.°
- When leaving home for days or weeks, Do Not turn off the AC system.
- Do not leave exterior doors, including garage entry doors and windows, open to allow humid air to enter the home.
- Run the bathroom exhaust fans during and after showering (15-30 minutes after shower).
- When cooking, turn on the vent over the stove to remove excess moisture from the home.
- Report all leaks and moisture problems as soon as they occur.
- Do not block air vents with furniture, clutter, drapes, or other items. Blocking air vents can cause restricted airflow and prevent the system from functioning correctly.

# **Maintenance Corner**

Instead of snow, we have a rainy season that is great for our plants and yards. What happens though when you get too much rain and your beloved backyard is flooded?

Some things you can do to help are to avoid walking on the grass until most of the water has evaporated. If puddles are taking too long to dry up, try pushing the water to the side. The soil surrounding the area may be less compact. Finally, spike the lawn with a garden fork, creating large holes in the yard. This should allow the majority of the water to drain through.
