Dear HMC Resident, On September 11, 2001, almost 21 years ago, 246 people went to sleep in preparation for their morning flights. 2,606 people went to sleep in preparation for work in the morning. 343 firefighters went to sleep in preparation for their morning shift. 60 police officers went to sleep in preparation for morning patrol. Eight paramedics went to sleep in preparation for the morning shift. They all died heroes. The one thing we can all do is to recognize that their lives were not lost in vain. I ask you to join me in vowing to "never forget" and to continue living our lives stronger and more unified. In memory of 9-1-1, Hunt Military Communities and Hunt Heroes Foundation is once again hosting the Patriot Essay Contest. This is open to any child between the ages of 8 -18. We are looking to read the personal reflections from children who understand and embrace the importance of patriotism, even though they never experienced the tragedy of 9-1-1.
